Ronald Reagan (He served as president of the Screen Actors Guild from 1947 to 1952.)



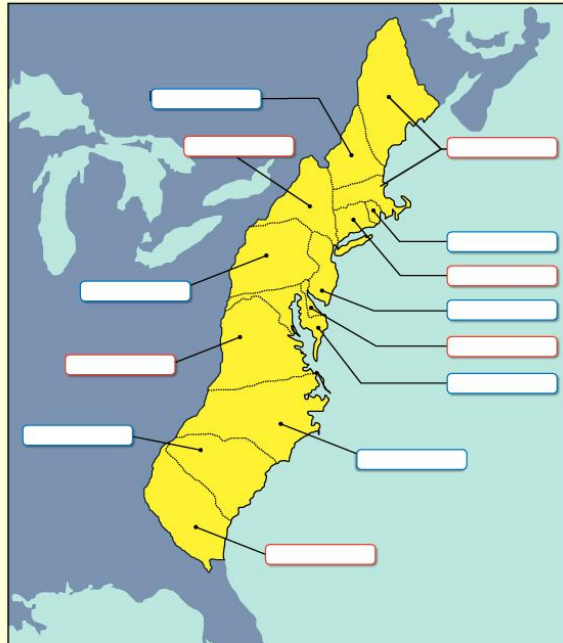
